

"SILENCE IS GOLDEN, SILENCE IS OKAY, SILENCE IS SOMETIMES PREFERRED."



The first time Brendan Devlin heard this phrase was during a volunteer orientation at Friends for Hospice in 2005. Since then, Brendan has tried to apply this concept to his everyday life and various volunteer roles. Brendan became interested in volunteering at Friends of Hospice while escorting his father-in-law to treatment sessions while he battled cancer. He noticed the minimal companionship many cancer patients had while receiving their treatments at the hospital. Brendan wanted to contribute in some way.

Brendan started his volunteering doing In-Home Support. His first Client was a US/Vietnam veteran fighter pilot with a disease that soon robbed him of his voice. Brendan immediately forgot the silence rule. He was surprised to be invited back considering he talked his Client's ear off. As the sessions continued and Brendan began to listen to his client, he was amazed by the stories that were told. Another Client of Brendan's had Asperger's Syndrome and would speak for hours. Brendan would just sit and listen and for his Client and their caregiver, it was just the support they needed.

During the pandemic, Brendan also became a Residence volunteer in Hein House at our Ruddy-Shenkman Hospice. One of his most memorable experiences was when he sat with a Resident who was unresponsive and alone. His family was out of town and would not make it

to his bedside when he died. Brendan, for the man's last hour, sat with him and noticed he was holding a rosary. Brendan said the Rosary with him and held his hand until he died. It was a simple gesture, but Brendan felt comfort knowing that the man had died with someone by his side.

Throughout Brendan's various volunteer roles at Hospice Care Ottawa, he has seen and listened to joy, laughter and happiness fill the halls of hospice. He doesn't consider it a sad place, but rather a place where family and friends can gather with their loved ones in their final days to create incredible memories together.

Volunteers constantly make a positive impact on our Clients, Guests and Residents. However, many of those individuals teach volunteers life lessons and give us different perspectives on life. Brendan has been able to learn from so many people here at Hospice Care Ottawa because of one phrase he learned many years ago - silence is golden, silence is okay, silence is sometimes preferred.

Congratulations to Brendan, who is this year's recipient of the June Callwood Award for the ongoing, compassionate care he provides in Residence, In-Home Support and in our Grief and Bereavement programs.

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COINCIDENCES AND FULL CIRCLE MOMENTS

Sometimes in life you experience coincidences, and sometimes there are so many you might wonder if it is just meant to be?

Mary MacDonald grew up right here in Old Ottawa South, two streets over from our May Court Hospice. Mary spent her childhood walking in Windsor Park, her Saturday nights watching movies at the Mayfair theatre, and summer days swimming at Brighton Beach. When Mary was raising her four children, they stayed in the neighbourhood, and enjoyed the same spots.

When Mary's youngest daughter Mary Beth was born in 1962, she and her mother spent a week at the May Court convalescent home to acquaint themselves as mother and newborn. This began their connection with Hospice Care Ottawa's May Court site.

When Mary Beth's father, Earle, took ill in 2018, he came to May Court Hospice. When he arrived, Earle was brought to room 5, overlooking the garden and river. Earle was carefully shaved, bathed and put in fresh pyjamas. Mary Beth was able to spend that night in a cot beside his bed. Everyone was so kind and caring looking after their needs. Mary Beth was offered soup for comfort, and kindness and compassion from everyone she encountered. Knowing he was well taken care of gave her peace of mind.

Before Earle died, he asked Mary Beth, "You promise you'll take care of your mother?" Mary Beth agreed she would. After her father died, Mary Beth and her family took part in the walk out. She described this experience as beautiful and helpful for everyone in the family. Walking her father out, surrounded by staff and volunteers, gave them a sense of peace and comfort knowing he was treated with such dignity and care. This helped them in the days and weeks following to move through their grief and to go on without him.

Several years later when Mary Beth's mother Mary became ill, the family found themselves back at our May Court Hospice and, wouldn't you know it, in room 5. Mary Beth and her family were grateful to be surrounded by comfort and care for Mary. Staff and volunteers were so kind, attentive to their needs, and lovingly supportive. This gave Mary Beth the gift of knowing she had fulfilled her father's last wish and taken care of her mother during her last days.

The coincidences and full circle moments for Mary Beth and her family at our May Court Hospice are remarkable. Thanks to the love and care provided by staff and volunteers, Mary Beth has shown her appreciation by making a generous contribution to Hospice Care Ottawa.


