Services aim to provide residents and their loved ones with an experience in palliative and end-of-life care which is supportive and peaceful, surrounded by caring that reflects as closely as possible to a comfortable home environment. The HCO programs include day hospice, home support, family services and residential hospice services. Hospice Care Ottawa relies on and values the contribution of over 900 volunteers who contribute to every aspect of our programs. Hospice Care Ottawa is looking for people to work in a supportive integrated environment who are committed to providing the highest quality palliative and end-of-life care.

General Description:

RPN nursing positions of 2 to 4 shifts a week at 0.65 to 0.70 FTE within a community based residential Hospice - May Court Hospice (114 Cameron Ave, Ottawa, ON) and Ruddy Shenkman Hospice (110 McCurdy Drive, Kanata, ON). Permanent positions allow the employee to be eligible for paid personal/sick days, accrued vacation for future use, and group benefits. This position is part of the CUPE Local 2017 and are guided by the Collective Agreement.

Key Responsibilities:

Plans, coordinates, delivers and supports a team to provide day to day end-of-life palliative care for the residents in the Hospice and their families and/or significant others.

Reporting relationship:

1. Reports to the Team Leader(s) and/or the Manager of Residence Care.
2. Supervises - Under the direction and supervision of the Team Leader(s), the care team, including volunteers, provides end-of-life palliative care to the residents in the Hospice, and provides support to their families and/or significant others.

Qualifications & Background:

1. Current registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario
2. LEAP Certification or willingness to obtain within 6 months
3. A strong sense of dedication to the mission, vision and values of Hospice Care Ottawa
4. Knowledge and experience in Hospice Palliative Care
5. Excellent communication skills
6. Leadership skills
7. Understands Ethics as they relate to Hospice Palliative Care
8. Ability to work as part of a team
9. Ability to give and take direction
10. Physically able to assist bedridden and disabled patients

12. Bilingualism an asset

Key Performance Indicators:

1. Quantitative and measurable results expected
2. Qualitative results to be achieved contributing to the success of the incumbent.
 - Provides guidance and direction to Personal Support Worker (PSW) as necessary
 - Provides guidance and direction to Residence Volunteers as necessary
 - Ensures that personal care to patients is carried out appropriately
 - Administers medications to residents as prescribed
 - Administers treatments to residents as prescribed
 - Provides emotional support to residents and families/significant others as appropriate. Refers family members to the Family Support Program as necessary
 - Maintains records through appropriate charting, ensuring confidentiality
 - Reports routinely to the Team Lead/Manager of Care
 - Carries out the appropriate procedures when a residents dies
 - Carries out duties and responsibilities as designated by the Team Leads in his/her absence.
 - Participates in daily Resident Team meetings (Rounds).
 - Liaises with physicians as necessary
 - Liaises with Pharmacies as necessary
 - Liaises with and mentors medical residents as necessary
 - Mentors new staff
 - Participates in Student mentorship as required
 - Participates in education opportunities (providing and receiving)
 - Participates in annual Hospice Health and Safety Update(s) and Skills Week
 - Participates regularly in Residence team meetings
 - Participates on committees as required
 - Participates in Hospice activities (i.e. Hike, Volunteer appreciation)
